PASTOR'S PAUSE

Proverbs 29:18 "Where there is no vision, the people perish ..."

Dear Friends in Christ,

School bells are ringing; whistles on the volleyball court and football fields are blowing; the cross-country team is pounding the roadways; band is tuning around and marching about; it is late summer and people's schedules are taking on a more orderly form. Well, where did the summer go? Spring just arrived just a couple of weeks ago, right?

When I went to college and seminary, I looked at education as a challenge, a puzzle that needed to be solved. Now I didn't see grade school and high school this way. I saw it as a nuisance. I want to encourage our young people to look at school differently, in a positive light, as a challenge that needs to be conquered. When we look at education in a more positive light, it makes school so much easier.

Through the struggles of school, we learn how to cope with life. Life is full of struggles; ups and downs, lefts and rights, U-turns and blind turns. Life is never easy and never goes as we plan. I think that this is one of the things that school is meant to teach us. Years ago, I enjoyed watching "Girl Meets World." Cory, the dad/ teacher, instills these moral values and life situations in his classroom.

Life is a big classroom and God is our Teacher/ Savior. He takes us through those difficult times so we will mature, grow in our faith journey and rely on Him to make it through life.

Stop and look at the world around you. Notice that it is an open canvas with paint splattered here and there, all around. We are to paint our life journey. Don't fret; the Master Painter is there to help us.

I like the song, "I Never Promised You A Rose Garden." As Christians, myself included, we think that if we "believe" in God, life should be easy, but God didn't promise us that. God did promise to walk with us through life.

Although we don't ponder this much, Jesus struggled through life as well. His mother didn't understand Him, His brothers and sisters and home town folks didn't understand Him. Actually, they said He was not in His right mind. Jesus was the only righteous and holy person who ever lived and the "church" leaders didn't understand Him.

I have to chuckle to myself; when I ask how much rain we received after a shower. Usually the person will shrug their shoulders and say, "I don't know... a lot." Now in the Midwest farming and ranching communities, rain is measured by the 10^{ths} and even 100^{ths} . Go and ask a farmer in Nebraska how much rain they received and they will not hesitate to say, 30/100s or 3/4 of an inch of rain. Rain is a very precious commodity in different parts of the country.

Depending on where you live, the different environmental stimuli says a lot about what you perceive as being important. There are things in our environment and social structure that people often take for granted. This realization should help us see that people are like different regions of the country; what is significant and vital for one, may not be for the other.

But there are things happening in our culture that should concern us: "Cancel Culture" and "Wokeness." Cancel Culture is along the line of: If I don't like what you are saying, I will shout you down, trying to make you look like a fool in some way. I will plug my ears and say nay, nay, nay so I can't hear you. Wokeness or Woke Culture is that one has to accept a certain way of thinking and if that person doesn't then they are made to look foolish. All of this is against what we, as Christians, are to be about.

Along the same line they are trying to quiet pastors. When pastors are preaching and teaching about sins, this group of people (Cancel Culture and Wokeness) are calling it hate speech, wanting authorities to arrest pastors to shut them up. The Truth cannot be quieted. The Truth of God will go forth and convict people of their evil ways. God has won and will continue to win. Praise the Lord.

Also, you may sign up for Altar Flowers on the chart posted in the Social Hall. This can be in memory of a loved one or friend or to commemorate a special event.


To make a donation you may use one of the envelopes in the Welcome Center and place in the collection plate, the safe or call the Church Office at 362-3244.
