PASTOR'S PAUSE

Proverbs 29:18 "Where there is no vision, the people perish"

Dear Friends in Christ,

October is upon us and we feel the warmth leaving and the cold coming in. This is the time we start to winterize the house. In the gardening world this is a time to get everything out of the garden and maybe prepare it for next year. For the farmer this is the end of the bean and the beginning of the corn harvest.

October is seen as the harvest month; we see what we call the harvest moon which is big and orange in color and there are harvest festivals across the nation. Then we read John 4:35 "Don't you have a saying, 'It's still 4 months until harvest'? I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest."

Jesus wants to use us to share the gospel message with others and what a time to do this. Families have already taken their vacations and the kids are back in school. And Fall school brings about what? Football, volley ball, marching bands and indoor events. Space-wise, we are closer together and what a better opportunity than to share God's grace and invite people to church.

Inviting people to church is not a time to be timid. As you have a conversation with others where you have gathered, a sporting event or musical event, just causally invite those people to church if they are not going to church. Sometimes people will say that they belong to a church; ask them are they going and if not encourage them to go to their church or invite them to ours. Greet them at the door so that they don't feel awkward coming to a strange church.

At the end of October kids think of one event: Halloween. Yes, Halloween is a time to dress up in fun customs and go door to door or a gathering to get as much candy as one can get. That night and the next day the kiddies will be drunk with a sugar high and will be climbing the walls like a cat.

October 31st the Lutheran Church and a few others celebrate Reformation Sunday. When there is one entity, or lack of a better word, a big conglomerate, there is always a chance for corruption to seep into it. That is what happened to the Catholic Church decades ago. Catholic comes from the Greek word that means "universal."

There was corruption in the Church for centuries: wealthy men bought positions in the church hierarchy and the clergy made people pay for penitence. Abuses such as the sale of <u>indulgences</u> (or spiritual privileges) and other charges undermined the church's spiritual authority. This money would go into individual church leaders' pockets and they would live like princes or it would be used to build cathedrals. These are just a few of the disillusionments with the church.

We credit Martin Luther as being the great reformer and he was, but there were other great men who tried to reform the Church before Martin Luther: Peter Waldo (c.1140-c.1205) John Wycliffe (ca. 1320-1384) and Jan Hus (1369-1415) Cardinal Giles of Viterbo, 1512 said, "Man must be changed by religion, not religion by man." Wessel Harmensz Gansfort (1419-1489) Cardinal Francisco Ximénes de Cisneros (1436-1517) and Desiderius Erasmus (1466-1536).

Luther was able to make such a great impact because of the Gothenburg Printing Press. This enabled Luther's writings to be printed in large quantities and throughout the region. All of the other reformers had to depend on scribes to get their writings circulated.

Halloween is a derivative of "All Helos Eve." It is a day before a holy day that we in the Church call "All Saints Day." "All Saints Day" is always the first of November and we, people on earth, recognize our connection with God-fearing people who are now no longer with us, but we are with God in heaven.

We don't think a lot about our connection with the saints in heaven. When followers of God die, we say they are in heaven and we are here on earth (we are separated from one another). In God's creation and being a part of the spiritual world, we are connected. We on earth are called the Church militant and those who have died in the Lord are called the Church triumphant.

There it is, more than you wanted to know and then some.


