

# **GROWING WITH GRACE**

Growing with Grace was the passion and mission of a Grace Lutheran Church member and Masters level elementary school teacher, Leeanne Cuddy. Leeanne was pregnant with her second child, Anna when she decided that she no longer had a desire to continue teaching in the public school system and wanted a place to send her children with a faith based and student-based ideology. She began her mission in early 2013 with a group of dedicated church members who were a vital part of getting the project from idea to reality. These original GWG board members were Missy Cornelius, Roxy Vanderpoel, Lisa Boser-Miller, Lynda Krakat and numerous other church members who lent their expertise to the project.

After extensive research, monthly meetings, trial playgroups and eventually state licensing, the school was ready to open early in 2014. The school began with three employees (including Keelan Miller, the future Director of GWG), and two classrooms. Leeann began working in multiple capacities, balancing director duties and serving as the Lead Preschool and PreK teacher while Keelan served as the Lead Infant/Toddler teacher. In the early days of the program, we served a group of students largely comprised of GLC kids and teacher's kids. Within a year, we were serving students from 6 weeks old up to six years old. We grew in size and identity. Our program focused on teaching the "whole child" which included a mission to teach them to give back to the community. GWG was involved in a vast number of local missions and community efforts to make Bradford a better place to live and for our kids. We taught students to have a servant's heart, and be a positive change in the world. This mission went hand in hand with one of our community partners, the United Way.

In 2015, we grew to a size that required that we split infants from the toddlers and added a third classroom and new teachers.

We continued to grow, and again in 2016 created a space for Jr. Preschool students (2-3-year olds) as well as transforming the youth group room (room 121) for before and after school and summer care for School-Aged students (6-12 year olds). School-age students began and ended their school day at Grace, being bussed or walking to their destination with our dedicated staff. At this point in the school's history, we were fully operational with 5 classrooms and upwards of 20 employees at any given time. We utilized the CDA program at the Bradford Area High School, which trained students to be staff members and encouraged them to work for area facilities after school. Also, a vital part of our success in these days, was a vast network of college students who sought out flexible and meaningful work at GWG.

With continued efforts to grow and improve our facility, we joined the Early Learning Resource Center, Rising STARS Program. This program provided us with an Early Education coach, and a new goal using their "good, better, best" model for quality programs. We immediately strove for the "best" in each area and quickly became recognized as a quality program. We earned the KEYSTONE STAR BRIGHT STAR AWARD for the 2015/2016 school year. We grew from here, earning our Keystone Star Level 2 in 2015. Each progressive STAR level displayed our hard work and dedication to the program but also came with increased monetary rewards for staff who participated in professional development and continuing education. We received monthly tuition add-on bonuses and grant opportunities for the program through the Early Learning Resource Center program as well. This program was vital to our program's early success, but also came with a cost for employees expecting them to perform at a very high level with minimal personal gain. It was with all of the educational and professional expectations that the dedication of each staff member was tested and reflected daily in the quality of care that was provided to our students. Our STAR 3 level was earned in March 2016.

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Leeann Cuddy suffered the loss of her mother and had a difficult time maintaining her commitment to the program. She eventually moved with her family to Ohio, and the church was without a school director. We were granted 6-month temporary license to operate with a college student standing in the position through the summer. The clock was ticking to find an appropriate replacement with the credentials to continue the mission of Growing with Grace Christian Preschool. The pastor at the time, Patrick Cox, persistently contacted Keelan Miller, to take on the responsibility always ending the conversation with "just pray on it". After four or five of these such conversations, Keelan accepted the position in October of 2017. The Assistant Director, Laci Wyant, played a vital part in keeping the building running during those rocky months between Leeann and Keelan.

We were the first Early Education program in Bradford to earn the highest STAR level in 2019. Multiple full day site inspections and years of working to improve our program had paid off. The staff celebrated this momentous news during our yearly staff in-service day. The staff was broken into two groups to solve a word riddle that told them the good news. "WE EARNED OUR 4th STAR". The realization hit when the first team to complete the riddle shouted it out, and screaming and celebration ensued throughout the room. E continued to be the only STAR 4 facility in Bradford until the public preschool with all of their resources met us at the top of the Lattice.

In March 2020 we were thrust into a worldwide Covid pandemic. We closed for six short weeks after being given an "essential worker" status by the state. We were allowed to return to Grace with very strict guidelines and regulations. Regulations such as social distancing our children (I don't know if you have tried to keep 2-6-year-olds away from each other but it's not easy), and masking ourselves and our students (also, not easy). This was a challenging time for many reasons, but our staff and families rose to the occasion and like many other trying times in our school's history. The pandemic strengthened our resolve to continue the school as well as strengthening our bonds with the GWG families.

Managing the pandemic and keeping our doors opened afforded us multiple financial opportunities to update and upgrade our facility. We removed carpet throughout the school and replaced with tile and laminate flowing; added a bathroom; installed new sinks; added air purifiers and improved cleaning equipment. Updates were approved by the state if health/safety benefits were cited.

After a year of operating through the pandemic, Easter of 2021, the controversial masking guidance was lifted. A sense of normalcy returned to the classrooms, though staffing was an area that was never "normal" again for GWG. We struggled for years because we were unsuccessful at securing dependable and qualified staff to compliment our core group of teachers. Because we couldn't hire competent staff, began turning perspective students/families away from our program. We were no longer growing, but shrinking. There was no lack of interest in our program, rather the appropriate number of staff to operate.

In August 2023, GWG was forced to make the difficult decision to stop care in a classroom. Administration determined that in October 2023 the School-Age classroom would close. Though devastating for families, at this time, there was a free after school program available for these students. The decision provided Grace with time to determine the next move. Without proper staffing, and no prospects for this to improve, Growing with Grace Christian Preschool Leadership Staff held an emergency meeting in December 2023. During this meeting, the future of Grace was discussed and changing the program as a whole was discussed. In the end, the team determined that instead of sacrificing on quality, or changing the program that we had worked so hard to build, we would go out with Grace. Grace's last day of school was on May 31st, 2024.

We maintained that quality of education and care until our closure in 2024 vastly due to the fortitude and resilience of five core members who have been with the program for eight and nine years, Jean Keltz, Becky Papinchak, Liz Everetts, Gina Luzzi and Keelan Miller.

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
## **100 Years of Grace at Grace!**

Among any updates I can give you, the strongest sentiment is always that we wish you were here with us

to experience the blessing that these kids are, and to build life-changing connections with them.

#### Backstory and reflection time:

I sat down in my office today and started to think about what I should tell you all about the CLC and our aspirations for the summer. Jacob came in, as he often does, and I asked him what he thought I should put in the newsletter about us. You read his very first thought above.

Sometimes it's hard to tell if the kids we spend time with appreciate our presence or if they appreciate what the CLC has to offer. It can be easy to get bogged down in the paperwork, and the attendance numbers. Or to focus too much on how often we have to scold, correct, suspend. Easy to get discouraged by the times when kids DON'T listen, or when they go off topic in our lessons.

But God.

God is working in the midst of everything. And my job is to keep on pressing on, be anxious for nothing, and let God move.

*Finally, brothers and sisters.....think about these things.* Whatever is true. Behind the distracting comments and bunny trail conversations, you can find deep and meaningful questions during our bible lesson discussions. They're learning and growing!

Whatever is noble. Watch closely. Our older kids are so good at engaging with the younger kids and including them in games and activities.

Whatever is right. We have adults here who build intentional connections with our kids in order to disciple them in the Lord.

Whatever is pure. Our kids demonstrate fierce loyalty to their friends and family. They express a desire and expectation for things to always be fair and just.

Whatever is lovely. There is laughter and joy in our building. Whatever is admirable. The kids receive a "blessing buck" whenever they make a stand-out decision, go out of their way to be helpful or kind, or go above and beyond in any way. We hand out SO many of these each week! Whatever is excellent or praiseworthy. Volunteers and staff have built a culture that keeps kids coming back. In the last 2 years we have seen attendance grow from an average of 64 kids in a month, to 197 kids in a month, to now in 2024 we have averaged 271 kids a month! Thank you God, for all of these beautiful facts.

#### So what's next? How can we keep growing this mission? I'm glad you asked.

#### Our Summer Vision will be focusing on the questions "Who am I?" and "Who do I want to become?"

All summer long we'll be working on something I like to call


#### "The Mirror Project"
