Pondering Along The Way

Generous Grace,

Our journey of 50 Days Ablaze is beginning. I am so thankful and blessed with the strong turnout for this journey. Thank you.

In our journey, one of the four mission responses that we will consider is "Give." We live in tough economic times. Jobs are lost. Finances are tight. The future is uncertain. These are days that create anxiety and uncertainty.

There are many that are willing to offer their viewpoint as to why this is happening. Yet, the one view that we should concern ourselves with is that of God – what does He think? What might be God's purpose in an economy like ours?

Biblically, I am led to see from the eyes and heart of God, four potential purposes for this recession. I am appreciative of John Piper whose writing has given me eyes to see this from God's point of view.

- 1. It is His intent for this difficult time to expose any area of our life where we have placed our trust in something other than Himself.
- 2. It is His will that we awaken to the needs of so many in this world who live in far deeper poverty, year-round.
- 3. It is God's intent, in the words of John Piper "... to relocate the roots of our joy in His grace rather in our goods, in His mercy rather than our money and in His worth rather than our wealth."
- 4. It is the desire and plan of God to advance His kingdom the proclaiming of Christ's work and victory at exactly a moment when worldly resources are least able to accomplish it. In doing this, God is glorified in accomplishing what everyone else thought impossible through the generosity of His Church.

The world is understandably tightening its belt. There is a place for a life of frugality and careful financial planning. There is also a place for a life of generosity. That place is in the presence of God who is Himself outrageously generous. He is the one who has called us to reflect His likeness and light to a world lost in the darkness and fear of sin.

Do you remember when Katrina hit, even the news stations commented on how the most effective, generous support was that which came from the local churches throughout the nation?

That was a dark moment in our country in which the light of the Gospel shone brilliantly. In the actions and service of the church, the world saw Jesus.

This is such a moment again. It is precisely at a time like this when our generosity will give witness to the generous love we know and enjoy from God, through Christ Jesus.

This is not just wishful thinking. This is the will of God. He expresses it this way.

II Corinthians 9:10-13 Now he who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will also supply and increase your store of seed and will enlarge the harvest of your righteousness. 11You will be made rich in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God.

This service that you perform is not only supplying the needs of God's people but is also overflowing in many expressions of thanks to God. 13Because of the service by which you have proved yourselves, men will praise God for the obedience that accompanies your confession of the gospel of Christ, and for your generosity in sharing with them and with everyone else.

This is God's vision for His church – for us at Grace, here in Bradford. As we live generously, we reflect the image and likeness of Him who created us and has called us to be light and salt to the earth.

Living in this fashion is not always easy. Pressures and influences from the world around us would have us think otherwise. The values of the world are to think for yourself – because who else will? Hold tightly to what you have because you just do not know what tomorrow brings. This, however, is not the way of the cross. "Though He was rich, yet for our sake, He became poor…" We are called to a different life, a different drumbeat.

I humbly share this with you to ponder and pray over, trusting that the Holy Spirit will guide us and stir us as He will.

Women's Bible Study


We will be meeting on October 10th and 24th at 10:30am in the church social hall.
