Linens, paraments, ornaments, and candles are removed from the altar and chancel. This is an ancient custom of the Church done on Maundy Thursday. It points to the humiliation of Jesus at the hands of the soldiers. As the altar is being stripped, we listen to the words of Psalm 22.
