Pondering Along the Way

The Walls of our Prison

As we enter October, my thoughts are drawn to Autumn and leaves and the pumpkins. Looking ahead to the end of the month, my heart is drawn to the Reformation.

Martin Luther knew all too well how sin kept him a slave. He tried everything to gain God's favor. He nearly froze himself to death as he slept, believing God would have mercy on him for his devotion. He carried out one religious act after another, only in the end to ask, "who knows whether it is so or not?" He spent hours and hours in the confessional booth to cleanse himself of his sin. Other priests would seek to avoid him because of this, with the exception of Father Staupitz. He became a trusted confessor. At one point he advised Luther that his problem would be resolved by loving God. Luther said in response;

"Is it not against all-natural reason that God out of his mere whim deserts men, hardens them, damns them, as if he is delighted in sins and in such torments of the wretched for eternity, he who is said to be of such mercy and goodness? This appears iniquitous, cruel and

intolerable in God, by which very many have been offended in all ages. And who would not be? I was myself more than once driven to the very abyss of despair so that I wished I had never been created. Love God? I hated him! "(Bainton, 1978, p. 44).

Luther knew that like Adam, he was naked before God. His struggle was the same as Isaiah, "how can a man stand before a holy God?"

He found himself in a prison of four walls constructed of these questions.

Can I be free from my sin?

Is there a Judgement Day?

Is God indifferent to my sin?

Must I then be damned?

Luther felt lost and doomed. There was no way he could free himself from his sin. He knew deep in his soul, that God would not wink at his sinful life and so therefore he must be damned. He was a slave to his sin.

Then one day as Luther was preparing to teach Romans to his theological students, he came to verse 17 and read, "For in the Gospel a righteousness from God is revealed, a righteousness that is by faith...."

Luther said later, "I realized for the first time that my own justification depends, not on my own righteousness which will always fall short, but it rests solely and completely on the righteousness of Jesus Christ which I must hold on to by trusting faith....it was as if the gates of paradise had opened:

Sin makes us its slave but the righteousness of Jesus himself, is yours. The door of your prison is open. The walls have been knocked down by the power of the Gospel. Can you be free from your sin? Yes, in Christ there is no condemnation. (Romans 8:1)

Is there a judgement day? Yes and in Christ you have been judged already. "Not Guilty" is the verdict through Jesus! (John 3:18) Is God indifferent to my sin? No. Sin matters to God and He shows that in punishing His Son for you. (Isaiah 53:10) Must I then be damned. No! In Jesus, you and I are forgiven and cleansed in His blood! (Romans 5:1)

You are free from sins control of you. Free from Satan's lies. Free from the condemning voice of your past. Free is Free.

I leave you with this quote by Luther, when Satan was assaulting him; "When the devil throws our sins up to us and declares we deserve death and hell, we ought to speak thus; "I admit that I deserve death and hell. What of it? Does this mean that I shall be sentenced to eternal damnation? By no means. For I know one who suffered and made a satisfaction in my behalf. His name is Jesus Christ, the Son of God. Where He is, there I shall be also."

"Where He is, there I shall be also." When Satan assaults you, may the truth and the confidence of this thought, fill your heart and soul with peace.

Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. (Mark 12:30 NIV)
